

Your poster at #IPBESI

Based on the letter by the IPBES Secretariat to IPBES stakeholders on 23 September 2024.

There is an opportunity to **highlight IPBES-related stakeholder initiatives during #IPBES11**: you are invited to submit a poster on your activities. Approved posters will be

- → displayed during #IPBES11 Stakeholder Day, 9 December 2024.
- → displayed throughout the entire 11th IPBES Plenary session, 10-16 December 2024.
- → posted to the #IPBES11 Stakeholder Day webpage.

The posters should showcase *exclusively* **examples of successful uptake and impact of IPBES outputs**: illustrations of how stakeholders have used IPBES assessments or other outputs and the impact achieved.

Designing your poster & getting approval

To be approved by the IPBES secretariat, your poster must fall under the topic above, *and* meet the following conditions and requirements:

- Posters should not be smaller than A3 in size (29.7 x 42.0 cm) and not larger than A1 (59.4 x 84.1 cm), exclusively in 'portrait' format/layout.
- A maximum of two posters per individual/organization will be accepted.
- Please include in the submission the author's name and country/institutional affiliation. The submission email must also include an indication of which IPBES output is highlighted in the poster.

To get approval, send an electronic copy of your poster to <u>stakeholders@ipbes.net</u> **before 10 November 2024**.

Producing & sending your poster

- IPBES will *not* be responsible for printing of the posters; authors must please bring their printed poster to the venue in Windhoek, Namibia.
- The IPBES Secretariat can organise transport of posters to Namibia for early submissions: submitters wishing to make use of this option must ensure their approved and printed poster reaches the IPBES Secretariat **before 1 November 2024**:
