What is the Restoration Academy?

The Restoration Academy is a tailor-made and engaging workshop format that enables restoration implementers to contribute to and benefit from the **United Nations Decade on Ecosystem Restoration (UN Decade)** and regional initiatives like the **AFR100**.

The UN Decade (2021–2023) and its global movement **#GenerationRestoration** aim to prevent, halt and reverse the degradation of our ecosystems around the world until 2030 – to improve people's livelihoods, combat climate change and halt the loss of biodiversity.

The Restoration Academy will cover a range of topics crucial to the success of ecosystem restoration and FLR including communication, networking, sharing of best practices, gender, monitoring and access to funding. As a participant you will receive customized training and benefit from knowledge sharing and peer-to-peer learning in a diverse and interactive learning environment.

So far, Restoration Academies have been successfully implemented among others in **El Salvador**, Togo, **Rwanda** and **Nigeria**.
