Proposed Opening Statement for IPBES-11 Plenary in Windhoek, Namibia

We advocate for the promotion of wider access to IPBES outputs, building on the success of the Invasive Alien Species Assessment. We urge governments to ensure that key findings and tools are communicated in accessible formats and languages, so all stakeholders can use them.

We encourage meaningful engagement and enhancing participation for Indigenous Peoples, local communities, youth, women and diverse stakeholders: to ensure inclusivity and equity in conservation towards a sustainable future.

As discussed in the development of the transformative change and nexus assessments, stakeholders are demonstrably essential in fostering transformative changes to address biodiversity loss and its intersections with climate, food, water, and health. We therefore call on IPBES members and all other actors to adapt their decision-making process to take into account the scientific findings and main messages from these IPBES assessments.

This requires increased efforts in capacity building and resource mobilization to enhance equitable participation and ensure representative expertise in IPBES processes.

Collaboration is key to reversing biodiversity loss and addressing the interconnected crises our world faces. Stakeholders stand ready to contribute to these shared goals. Together, we can create a more sustainable and equitable future.
